Borehole Camera



Main components of the GeoVISION[™] borehole camera system consist of a motorized winch with 1,000 feet of cable, color and low-light black and white cameras, winch-mounted LCD monitor, and DVD recorder. Cameras can be attached to a motorized pan-tilt mount or fixed to a manual-tilt head attached to the end of small-diameter CPVC pipe. Five-foot sections of pipe can be threaded together to achieve a length of up to 200 feet. The unit runs on 120 VAC which can be supplied by a generator (Honda EU2000i) or 12 VDC battery connected to a 300- or 1000-watt inverter. Supplementary lighting may be provided by various combinations of submersible flashlights or by either of two types of 500-watt 120 VAC lamps attached to a 500-foot cable. MCR has two similar

GeoVISION[™] winch/camera units.

Use:

- Examine wells, drill holes, and shafts whether flooded or dry.
- Examine sides and bottom of impoundments.

Maintenance:

No routine maintenance is required.
