TOPIC: SELF-BONDING

INQUIRY: Please conduct a survey of the states to determine which state programs use selfbonding as an alternative bonding system. Include copies of the state statutes and regulations. List the state contacts.

SEARCH RESULTS: A survey of 15 states was conducted, using a questionnaire and supplemented by COALEX Library research. The survey asked the following questions:

- 1. Does your state program contain authority for the use of self-bonding? If not, has your state program ever contained such authority ? Why did you decide to remove the self-bonding provisions?
- 2. Citation for relevant statutes and regulations.
- 3. Are you currently using self-bonding for any companies in your state? If so, how many companies?
- 4. Provide comments on the value and success of your state's self-bonding program as an alternative bonding system.
