Subject: Termination of Federal Permits

To clarify requirements for compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) when terminating a Federal permit that overlaps or duplicates a State permit for surface coal mining operations on Federal lands pursuant to the terms of a full-delegation cooperative agreement with a State, the following change is made.

Change paragraph 3.c. to read:

c. NEPA Compliance. The approved application for a Federal coal mining permit has already been subject to NEPA compliance. In most cases, terminating the Federal permit would not alter the original environmental document findings since the State permit will have incorporated all necessary permit conditions.

In those instances where the environmental impacts are adequately analyzed in a previous environmental assessment (EA) for the mining operation, an environmental reevaluation and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) is sufficient NEPA documentation, provided that the FONSI is based on adequate analysis in the EA to justify its findings. An example of an environmental reevaluation and FONSI is given in Appendix 1 to this Change Notice. Consult section 2.A. of the OSM NEPA Handbook (Directive REG-1) for further guidance on appropriate NEPA compliance documentation.
